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OVERVIEW

The purpose of the bachelor's degree in criminal justice is to provide students with an understanding of the foundational issues relating to and including various levels of law enforcement, the U.S. court system and the correctional process. The degree program is presented in such a way as to help students consider a potential career path in one of the related disciplines. Additionally, the degree provides the student integration of biblical perspective interfaced with the foundations, concepts and basic skills of criminal justice and research methodology, leadership and service.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

A bachelor's degree in criminal justice will prepare students for careers in: local, state and federal levels of law enforcement crime scene technology, forensic lab technician, probation, parole, crisis and emergency management, private security operations, cyber security, homeland security, pre-law school, child and family protective services

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Criminal Justice Faculty have advanced degrees in the criminal justice field and extensive experience working in one of the related disciplines.
- Successful graduates have gone on to work for various local, state, and federal police agencies and have become patrol officers, K-9 officers, SWAT operators, detective investigators, state troopers, U.S. Border Protection Agents, Homeland Security Agents, U.S. Marshals, U.S. Investigator's Service Agents, prosecuting and defense lawyers, adult and juvenile probation officers, state child and family protection investigators, private security operators, crisis management case workers/counselors, high school criminal justice instructors.
- Every criminal justice course includes active, hands-on participatory learning from forensic laboratory skills development, physical security crime evaluation, electronic surveillance, traffic stops, virtual de-escalation, physical and deadly physical force scenarios, active shooter suppression, security team operations, indoor and outdoor crime scene search, self-defense skills, emergency first aid, and more.
